In 1990, the Editorial Board started to reorganize the previous journal having been written mainly in Russian into an international one with the purpose to join the scientists dealing with oil shale research all over the world.

*Oil Shale*, the journal of the Estonian Academy of Sciences, is administered by the Estonian Academy Publishers from January 1999 and runs on a non-profit base.

Journal *Oil Shale* is indexed in the Science Citation Index® and in the following ISI® products: Current Contents®/Engineering, Computing, and Technology, SciSearch®, ISI Alerting® Servicessm.

In 2008 our journal opened the new column called *Oil Shale News* to publish short information concerning dissertations (the title, the author, short description and the link to the printed or online paper), information on new books, on new oil shale fields, technologies, chemicals factories, mines, conferences, meetings, etc. I would like to thank you all for sharing their

Also we would like to inform you about opening a new column called *Historical Reviews* to publish brief accounts or articles about investigations made earlier or information on the topic that is not generally accessible (including books), because it had been published prior to electronic capture of articles, and/or published in languages other than English.

Some important notes for authors:

Please familiarize yourselves with the instructions to authors from our website www.kirj.ee/oilshale before submitting the paper, including the style of *Oil Shale* when listing the references at the end of your paper.

It is essential that the paper be written in clear, proper English. If English is not your native language, we recommend that you ask a native English speaker to read over your manuscript before submitting. Please pay attention to the quality of figures. Handwritten lettering and low-quality computer graphics are not acceptable. Preferred file formats are TIFF, BMP, XCL, and CDR (resolution at least 300 dpi).

Before starting the research, please familiarize yourselves with the old issues of *Oil Shale* and capture the information from electronic databases.

Last but no at least I am very happy to say that the impact factor of *Oil Shale* has increased year by year. We are hoping that the tendency will last.
