FOREWORD

On 14 August 1994, the Estonian academic community was shocked and struck by the untimely death of one of its leading members, Dr. Andrus Park.

On 16 December 1994, just a few days before what would have been Andrus's 45th birthday, his colleagues, friends, and relatives gathered for a commemorative seminar, where the idea was put forward to publish Andrus's more recent works again in a special volume. As contributors to this volume, we thought the best place for such a publication would be the *Proceedings of the Estonian Academy of Sciences*, for it was to the present and the future of the Academy that Andrus devoted so much of his energy.

As such, this collection is not just a tribute to a lost colleague. It is also meant to make accessible his works, which are very important for Estonia and in Estonia. As an internationally-respected and published scholar, Andrus Park had an important role to fulfill in publicizing the problems and mere existence of the Estonian people as a nation restoring its independence.

Thus, in gathering these works of Andrus Park for re-publication we hope to expand the number of his readers, while remembering him as one

of the most talented and productive social scientists in Estonia.

We are greatly indebted to Andrus Park's widow Mrs. Tiina Park, who gave at our disposal materials otherwise not possible to obtain.
